Best Areas to Stay

Expect to pay a premium for Sydney accommodation near the harbour or in the CBD. Prices are cheaper further away from the harbour and in the suburbs

- **The Rocks** is an ideal location for a short stay in Sydney within walking distance of the harbour, Opera House & Circular Quay
- **Sydney CBD** is good for shopping & sight seeing
- **Darling Harbour** is a central location
- **Central** station is a bus ride away from the harbour & accommodation may be a bit cheaper
- **Bondi Beach** is about 5km outside the city with easy access to the CBD by ferry, train & bus
- **Manly Beach** is about half an hour from the city by ferry

- **MCA Café** at the Museum of Contemporary Art, Circular Quay
- **Botanical Gardens Café & Restaurant** located inside the gardens

- **Marigold** serves great Yum Cha in China Town
- **Din Tai Fung**, in China Town
- **Chongqing Street Noodles**, in China Town
- **Doyles** in Watsons Bay, Sydney's oldest seafood resaurant

Sydney Travel Tips

- **Free wi-fi** is common
- Buy a **SIM Card** for the most reliable internet access
- **Save \$** by packing a picnic lunch & refilling your water bottle
- **Tap water is safe** to drink
- **Taxis** are expensive. **Uber** is often a cheaper option
- Using **public transport** will save you money
- Buy an **Opal Card** to use on public transport. Swipe on & off when you travel & top up your card as needed
- **Electricity:** 3 pin plug type I
- Wear strong **sunscreen** to avoid sunburn
